



Safeguarding Policy

General Principles

Food and Farming Compliance is committed to providing a welcoming environment where everyone is respected and valued, and can feel safe and secure. It recognises its particular responsibility to safeguard the wellbeing of children, young people and adults considered to be at risk.

Disclosure and Barring Service checks (formerly known as CRB checks)

The Safeguarding of Vulnerable Groups Act 2006 (amended 2010) and the Protection of Freedoms Act 2012 stipulates that those individuals in contact with children, young people and adults at risk require a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check in order to carry out activity known as “regulated activity”. Such regulated activity is defined in detail by the aforementioned legislation. Food and Farming Compliance will undertake DBS checks where the member of staff/ tutor’s role in any learning event or associated activity falls under the definition of regulated activity.
